Below you will find the rules and discipline procedures (both behavioral and homework) for our classroom.

Classroom Rules:

- 1. Follow directions the first time.
 - a. Listen carefully.
- 2. Keep hands and feet to yourself. Keep your mask on.
 - a. Respect other people and things.
- 3. Use hand signals and raise your hand to get out of your seat.
- 4. Use your inside voice.
- 5. Be kind to others.
 - a. Use kind words and actions.

Incentive Calendars:

Stickers/Stamps/Stars—Excellent behavior all day

A—Poor attitude

NW-Not working

T—Talking/noise making

NL—Not listening

O—Out of seat

D—Disobedient

FD—Not following directions

DS--Disrespectful of Students

DT—Disrespectful of Teacher

***Calendars will be sent home every day. Please initial the current day and send it back in the orange folder.

- *Students will begin each day with a clean slate and on the "Ready to Learn" section of the clip chart.
- *First incident of misbehavior will result in a verbal warning.
- *Second incident of misbehavior will result in "Think about it" move down on the clip chart.
- *Third incident of misbehavior will result in a move to "Loss of Privilege" which is a calendar mark and student will lose 5 minutes of recess.
- *Further misbehavior will result in possibly another calendar mark, more missed recess, a communication report, or student being sent to the office depending on the situation.
- *Incidents of misbehavior will be recorded on a calendar which is sent home daily.

*At my discretion students may be sent directly to the office without all of the above steps being followed.

*Students can also work their way up on the clip chart throughout the day onto "Making Good Choices" and "Outstanding" with an end of the week incentive for good behavior in the classroom.



Homework:

All homework must be returned the next day. If homework is not returned, the following will occur:

1st—Grace given

2nd—Grace given

3rd—Communication Report

4th—Detention

Homebound students:

Homebound students will be expected to follow the classroom rules as well. The students should have a quiet workspace at home. The student will be respectful of the students that are also virtual and the students in the class. They will be expected to stay on mute, unless told otherwise, to focus on the current lesson and work, and they will raise their hand in order to ask or answer a question. I will also give time at the end of lessons for homebound students to ask questions that they may have. If there is a problem online, I will be sending an e-mail to the parent/guardian that is at home with the student in order to address and resolve the issue.
