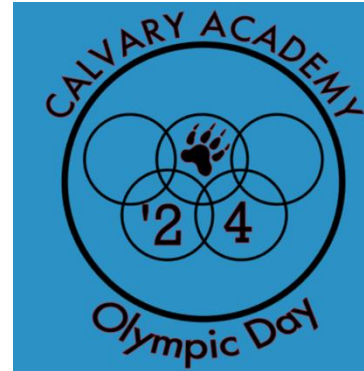

Doing the Right Thing for the Right Reasons

Have you ever found yourself doing something kind or noble, only to feel a wave of anger or disappointment when your efforts aren't appreciated? I have, and let me tell you, it's a humbling experience.

Once, I felt God nudging me to help someone. I knew this person wouldn't show any gratitude, but I pressed on, convinced it was the right thing to do. When my good deed went unnoticed, I found myself fuming. I turned to God, asking, "Why am I so upset? I did what you wanted!" His response was clear and piercing: "You were looking for praise from man, not from me. Focus on me."

That hit hard. I realized I was seeking affirmation from people rather than from God. When I didn't receive the recognition I craved, my emotions spiraled. It was a stark reminder of how easily our motives can become tangled.

In Colossians 3:23-24, Paul writes, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving." These verses encourage us to realign our focus. Our perspective shifts when we work to please God rather than seeking human approval. Our actions become acts of worship, and our joy is no longer tied to the fleeting praise of others.

Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector in Luke 18:9-14 further illustrates this point. The Pharisee prayed loudly, flaunting his righteousness, while the Tax Collector stood at a distance, humbly asking for God's mercy. Jesus declared that it was the humble Tax Collector who went home justified. This story reminds us that God values a humble heart over outward displays of piety.

So, let's make a conscious effort to keep our focus on God. Let's do the right thing because it pleases Him, not for the applause of people. When we do, we'll discover a more profound, more fulfilling joy that no human recognition can match.

Remember, God sees your heart and is always pleased when you choose to honor Him. Your worth isn't measured by the approval of others but by the love of the One who created you.
