### Stepping Out in Faith: Peter's Pool Party with Jesus

Scripture Reference: Mathew 14:29-31



"He said, 'Come.' So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, 'Lord, save me.' Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, 'O you of little faith, why did you doubt?'"

Have you ever been on the edge of a pool, heart racing, ready to dive in? You might have been wide-eyed, filled with excitement, trepidation, and a dash of fear.

That's probably how Peter felt when he stepped out of the boat in the middle of a storm, Jesus calling him onto the water. Peter wasn't just standing on the edge of a swimming pool. He was standing on the edge of a boat in the middle of a storm, with Jesus calling him out onto the water.

When Jesus said, "Come," Peter didn't hesitate. He didn't negotiate terms or ask for any guarantees. He just stepped out of the boat and started walking on the water, like playing hopscotch, being confident, and hopping happily.

But then, the wind, the waves, they caught his eye. He shifted his focus from Jesus to the storm and started sinking, and suddenly you're not just playing a game; you're in deep water (quite literally).

Isn't that just like us sometimes? We start a new job, relationship, or ministry with gusto, ready to make a difference, fully trusting in God. But then, things start getting tricky. The job's more complicated than we thought; the relationship has ups and downs, the ministry faces obstacles, and we look around and think, "This wasn't part of the deal."

But was it really not? Just like Peter probably hoped Jesus would calm the storm for his water walk, we start something new with gusto and trust God, but when the storms come, we wobble. We hope obedience will clear our path. Yet, God didn't promise a storm-free life but His eternal presence.

Peter may have slipped up, but when Peter cried out, "Lord, save me!" Jesus immediately reached out. He didn't let Peter sink. So remember, when you're sinking, Jesus is there. He might not calm the storm, but He'll be with you in it. And even if you do make a splash, think of it as an unexpected pool party. After all, storms and splashes are just part of the journey. Keep trusting, keep walking; Jesus has your back!

**Prayer:** Lord, give us the courage to step out in faith amidst life's storms. Please help us keep our focus on you. Thank you for being there to catch us when we falter. Amen
