### Course Overview:

The 8th grade class will be using the curriculum "Light bearers: A Biblical Christian Worldview Curriculum for Jr. High." Students will first, come to understand what a worldview is and see how all people have a worldview. Second, students will learn how all of life's biggest questions find their answer in Jesus Christ. Third, students will learn that ideas have consequences and that our beliefs determine our actions. The goal is that this curriculum will help the students learn how to be credible witnesses of The Truth, Jesus Christ, in a world that is becoming increasingly hostile to the truth of the Gospel.

### Student Responsibilities:

Students are expected to participate in class. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Participation in class discussions
- Completing the daily warm ups
- Thoughtfully journaling
- Taking notes during class
- Actively listening and participating in the lesson
- Taking the tests and quizzes
- Memorizing the required passages of Scripture
- Completing projects and assigned homework all to the *best* of their God given ability.

Students must come to class every day with their NIV Bibles, three subject notebook, assignment notebook, and both a red and a black/blue pen, class textbook: Lightbearers, and book: "*How to be a selfish pig.*" Students are responsible for communicating with the teacher about any concerns or questions they may have.

## 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Language Arts

### **Course Overview:**

*The eighth-grade language arts curriculum consists of literature, Accelerated Reading, language and writing. This curriculum is designed to provide eighth graders with in-depth and engaging avenues of learning in the comprehensive study of literature. This is accomplished through all genres, stories, poetry, essays, and drama. Students will apply and enhance their knowledge of plot development and other literary devices used within a story to employ critical thinking skills necessary for story comprehension. During the second half of the school year students will embark upon the reading and study of the acclaimed play, Romeo & Juliet. In terms of writing, students will learn how to properly research topics, persuade readers, and cite research in MLA format. Students will write papers that address various writing forms including informative, expository, narrative, persuasive, and poetic. There will also be opportunities for students to integrate technology into their literature experience. This will be done through the use of various programs such as PowerPoint to create a visual presentation to accompany their speeches and papers. Students will recall and employ the rules of grammar and spelling in written assignments on a daily basis as well as be exposed to new grammar terms and practices. Students will write both informally and formally for skill implementation and reinforcement. We will also focus on public speaking techniques as well as utilize interactive student notebooks. This curriculum is designed to cultivate language arts excellence, exposure and enjoyment.*

### **Participation and Assignments**

Students are expected to come to class prepared and willing to participate in class discussions. Students are responsible for communicating with the teacher about any concerns they have regarding assignments. Students are expected to complete homework and reading assignments on time **and to the best of their ability**. Students are expected to ensure that final presentations of all assignments are neat and well organized.

### **Plagiarism**

Plagiarism is a serious offense and will be treated with an office visit, a phone call home, and a grade deduction of a minimum of 20%.

### **Accelerated Reading**

Students are responsible for doing their Accelerated Reading on their own time, monitoring their progress and deadlines concerning A.R., and taking their AR tests in a timely manner. The A.R. goal for all 8<sup>th</sup> graders is 20.0 points for each quarter.

### Course Overview

This course will focus on American History from the time of its early European explorers until the present day. This study of American History is essential for students, as it gives them a good understanding of how our country was formed, how our state and federal governments operate, the rights of all Americans, the problems of our country in times past and presently, and a framework to help them better understand the time that they are living in. Additional emphasis will be placed on the study of the Constitution in preparation for a state issued test during the last quarter of the year.

### Student Responsibilities

To be successful in this class, students will need to come to class prepared, pay attention during class, participate in class discussions, be responsible for taking neat and detailed notes, complete their assignments on time, and study for tests and quizzes. Please note the following:

- Notebook checks will be done periodically and taken for a grade.
- Assignments must be completed correctly and must be turned in on time to receive full credit (students will only receive half the credit for late assignments).
- Student projects will be assigned throughout the year. Smaller projects will count as quiz grades, and larger projects will count as test grades.
- Students must be prepared to take quizzes and tests on the day they are given, or upon return to school if they are absent the day of the quiz or test. (Students who are not prepared to take a quiz or test after returning from an absence will be allowed the same number of days that they were absent to prepare for quizzes and tests.
- No re-takes are allowed on quizzes or tests.
- Cheating on quizzes or tests is a serious offense and will be treated with a phone call home and a grade of 0 points.

- Plagiarism is a serious offense and will be treated with an office visit, a phone call home, and a grade deduction of at least 20% of the final grade on the specified assignment.

### **Course Overview and Objectives**

Students will be using the *Realidades 2* textbook and practice workbook, in which most of the assignments will be found. In addition to these tools, our class will be using curriculum based reinforcement activities, audio CDs, videos/DVDs, puzzles, and other games to aid students in building a foundation for Spanish level B.

Students will develop additional speaking, listening, reading and writing skills in Spanish. Students will learn and utilize an extensive vocabulary in the following themes:

- *School*
- *Daily Routine*
- *Clothing*
- *Leisure-Time Activities*
- *Childhood*
- *Special Occasions*
- *Luxuries and Necessities*
- *Shopping*
- *Accidents and Illness*
- *Movies and Television*

Previous information from *Realidades A* and *Realidades B* will also be reviewed and used throughout the *Realidades 2* curriculum. Students will also be further introduced to grammatical rules and concepts needed for writing, reading comprehension, and verbal communication.

### **Student Responsibilities**

- Students will be expected to participate in in-class discussions, classroom assignments and activities (at a 6 foot distance at all times.)
- They are also expected to complete all homework and in-class activities. An ample amount of time will be given to complete any in class assignments, but any assigned work not completed during the class period will be homework.

- Students will be expected to complete all readings, homework assignments, projects, quizzes and tests.
- If a student does not complete their homework assignment they are expected to turn in a "homework slip" explaining why they did not finish their assignment. Records of homework slips will be kept on file for the length of the quarter. Parents may request to see homework slips at any point in time during that quarter.

### **Plagiarism**

### **Computers**

The computer lab teacher is Mr. Wilson. Students meet with him for one 48-minute period 2 quarters each school year.

### **Library**

**In-class students** may check out books for two weeks, after which time the students have the option of renewing the book. Mrs. Morgan is the librarian. We will create a schedule for your students to check out books to follow the current social distancing procedures.

**Homebound student** families may choose to check out books from their local library, and may check to see if the book is an AR book on [arbookfind.com](http://arbookfind.com). Books chosen should be the right reading level for the students' grade and ability (once assessed.) Have appropriate content. (Books shouldn't promote sex, profanity, witchcraft, bullying etc. You may also reference our school website for a list of AR books. Our librarian, Mrs. Morgan is diligently compiling more resources for your children to utilize at home.

## **Physical Education**

Physical education is held twice a week for 45 minutes. Mr. Ritzema is the physical education teacher. Students must have P.E. uniforms, deodorant and athletic shoes.

## **Chapel**

Chapel is held on Friday mornings. Due to the changes for this school year chapel will be held virtually. In class students will view a chapel message in their classrooms, and homebound students will view the chapel message via our youtube channel.

## **In-Between Class Tardy Policy**

Jr.High students have the added responsibility of being in their classrooms and seated before the passing period bell rings. If students are late a tardy slip will be issued. The following consequences will be issued for in-between tardies:

4 tardies = cannot participate in the next hot lunch.

8 tardies = cannot participate in the next jeans day.

12 tardies = student will serve one detention and cannot participate in the next hot lunch day.

16 tardies = student will serve a one day suspension.
