No One Remembers What You Did For Yourself

Scripture Reference: Luke 9:12-17



With Thanksgiving coming up next week, you probably find yourself in a situation where more people are attending dinner than you anticipated. And if we're honest, maybe more than you would like. Well, Jesus was sort of in the same situation. Remember the story of a little boy who shared his lunch of 5 loaves and 2 fishes, and Jesus took what the boy willingly shared and fed 5000? He had been healing all day, and His twelve disciples told Jesus to dismiss the crowd so they could get a bite to eat because it was getting late, and they were in the middle of nowhere.

This was Jesus' response: "You feed them," Jesus said. They said, "We couldn't scrape up more than five loaves of bread and a couple of fish—unless, of course, you want us to go to town ourselves and buy food for everybody." (There were more than five thousand people in the crowd.) But he went ahead and directed his disciples, "Sit them down in groups of about fifty." They did what he said, and soon had everyone seated. He took the five loaves and two fish, lifted his face to heaven in prayer, blessed, broke, and gave the bread and fish to the disciples to hand out to the crowd. After the people had all eaten their fill, twelve baskets of leftovers were gathered up." Luke 9:13-17

We often hear the phrase, 5 loaves, and 2 fishes. But in perspective, the boy giving got to eat more than he gave. He gave up 5 fish and 2 loaves so others would have. But in actuality, he didn't lose but gained. He ate more than the 5 loaves and received 12 loaves to take home. It's hard to believe among the 5000, his mom was the only one who thought to patch their child a lunch? Or wives to give their husbands and family food on the journey? No. But it appears that he was the only one willing to share. And he is the only one we still remember and talk about today.

Thanksgiving is a lot of work and preparation for the one hosting. It may appear a hassle for only a few hours. But your actions will never go unremembered. Any sacrifice done for others is always rewarded by God.

No one remembers what you did for yourself. They will remember the legacy God did through you.
